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		needs. - While the University may, at its discretion, seek accreditation or recognition from the relevant statutory councils, such approval is not a mandatory prerequisite. 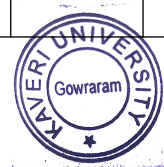

If yes, please give details	The University has a structured mechanism to support educationally disadvantaged students and academically weak learners in order to ensure equity and improved learning outcomes.
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		a) Bridge Courses: (i) Educationally disadvantaged students admitted to the University are identified at the time of admission. (ii) Bridge courses are organized before the commencement of each semester to strengthen their foundational knowledge and bring them on par with other students. b) Identification and Counselling: (i) At the end of every semester, academically weak students are identified based on their performance in examinations and continuous assessments. (ii) Such students are counselled individually by their respective faculty members, Heads of Departments, and Deans. (iii) Students with low CGPA (on a 10-point scale) are specifically monitored and counselled in the presence of their parents. c) Remedial and Tutorial Support: (i) Remedial classes are conducted by course faculty for academically weak students. (ii) Special tutorial sessions are organized by departments to provide additional guidance and academic support. (iii) Faculty members also conduct special teaching sessions during the semester, where any student can seek help in clarifying concepts and overcoming academic difficulties. d) Monitoring and Follow-up: (i) The performance of academically weak students is closely monitored in subsequent evaluations. (ii)
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		Corrective measures are taken to ensure continuous improvement and closure of the feedback loop. Through these interventions, the University ensures that students from diverse backgrounds are supported, guided, and provided with adequate opportunities to achieve academic success.

If yes, please give details	▪ The University extends financial assistance to economically and socially disadvantaged students to ensure that financial hardship does not hinder their education. Tuition fee waivers are granted on a case-by-case basis upon specific requests from deserving students. ▪ In particular, students whose parents' income was adversely affected during the pandemic, or those whose parents had no source of income, were provided with complete tuition and hostel fee waivers to enable them to continue and complete their studies without interruption. ▪ Additionally, students whose parents encounter financial difficulties are supported through: (i) Direct financial assistance, wherever feasible; (ii) Extension of fee payment schedules, providing additional time and flexibility to meet their financial obligations. ▪ Through these measures, the University reinforces its commitment to inclusivity and equal opportunity in higher education.

This committee ensures that the curriculum remains relevant, up-to-date, and aligned with industry requirements, academic standards, and emerging trends. - The Committee comprises faculty members from the respective departments and may also include industry experts or external advisors. It reviews the existing curriculum, considers feedback from stakeholders such as students, alumni, and faculty, and proposes modifications or updates for consideration by the BoF. - The recommendations of the Committee are subsequently deliberated in the Board of Faculty (BoF) meetings for individual programs and then
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		forwarded to the Academic Council for final approval. The Academic Council, which consists of both internal and external members, plays a pivotal role in ensuring academic quality and relevance. ▪ The composition of the Academic Council and the Board of Management is available on the University website www.kaveriuniversity.edu.in and is also provided in Please refer to Annexure – IV for reference

Procedure for Curriculum Revision ▪ The University follows a structured process for curriculum revision to ensure that all academic programmes remain relevant, rigorous, and aligned with industry requirements, regulatory guidelines, and emerging knowledge trends. ▪ The procedure followed for curriculum revision include – (i) review by Internal Review Committee, (ii) Feedback mechanism from students, industry, experts etc, (iii) Board of Faculty consideration & recommendations, (iv) Academic Council approval, (v) Implementation – Upon approval, the revised curriculum is notified by the University and implemented from the following academic session. ▪ Frequency of revision – Curriculum is reviewed at least once in 5 years, or earlier if mandated by the regulatory bodies (UGC, ICAR, AICTE), or driven by major industry / academic changes. ▪ Last curriculum update – The curriculum was last updated in 2024 for B.Sc. (Hons) Agriculture and 2025 for B. Tech courses.

Commencing from 2025, the University will implement a comprehensive Academic Audit to uphold the highest standards of quality and excellence across all academic programmes. This structured exercise will involve a systematic review of the curriculum, teaching methodologies, assessment processes, and student learning outcomes. ▪ The audit will be carried out by a panel comprising both external experts and internal stakeholders, ensuring an independent and balanced evaluation of academic strengths and areas for improvement. The outcomes of the audit will inform strategic initiatives to enhance programme quality, strengthen teaching–learning practices, and improve student outcomes, while consolidating the University’s reputation for academic excellence. ▪ By institutionalizing regular academic audits, the University reaffirms its commitment to continuous quality enhancement, accountability, and transparency, ultimately benefiting students, faculty, and the broader academic community. The development of a formal Academic Audit Framework is currently underway to operationalize this process.

Method of Evaluation of Answer Scripts ▪ The University follows a well-defined and transparent system for the evaluation of answer scripts. The process typically involves: a) Assessment of Content: Evaluating the accuracy, completeness, and relevance of answers in relation to the questions asked. b) Understanding and Application: Assessing



		the student's conceptual understanding and ability to apply knowledge to problem-solving or analytical situations. c) Grading Criteria: Scripts are evaluated against predefined grading rubrics, which include parameters such as correctness, clarity, logical presentation, depth of analysis, and overall quality of response. d) Internal and External Evaluation: To ensure impartiality and academic rigor, all question papers are set by external examiners. The evaluation of answer scripts is carried out in accordance with the University's prescribed regulations, with provision for both internal checks and external moderation wherever required. Question Paper Setting The syllabus of each course is sent to three external faculty members from other universities, who are entrusted with preparing the question papers. These papers are designed to include a variety of question types such as objective, short answer, problem-solving, long answer, and practical/field-based



		questions (Part A: 40 marks; Part B: 60 marks). ▪ The submitted question papers are then moderated by faculty identified by the Controller of Examinations, after which one question paper is selected for the final semester-end theory examination by the Director of Education / Vice Chancellor. ▪ The evaluation of answer scripts is carried out internally by faculty members other than the course instructor, ensuring impartiality and fairness in the assessment process.

Constitution of the Board of Question Paper Setters ▪ At the University, the Board of Question Paper Setters (BQPS) is constituted under the supervision of the Controller of Examinations (CoE) in consultation with the Dean of the respective School and approval of the Vice-Chancellor/Academic Council. The process ensures academic integrity, transparency, and subject expertise. 1) Composition ▪ Chairperson (Internal): A senior faculty member of the concerned department with adequate experience in teaching and examination processes. ▪ Internal Paper Setters: Selected from the university's faculty who have taught the course or allied subjects. ▪ External Paper Setters: Experts from other

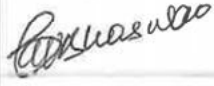

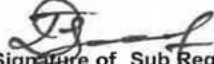

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- (ii) Any Person in, or of which, any of the Persons in paragraphs (i) above are directors, shareholders, partners or proprietors or in which any of the above have any control; and
- (iii) Any Relative of any of the Persons in paragraphs (i) to (ii) above;

"Relative" shall include an individual's father, mother, brother, sister, husband, wife, daughter, son, grandchildren, son-in-law and daughter-in-law, father-in-law and mother-in-law; and

"Trust Deed" shall mean this Deed of Trust, as may be amended, modified and supplemented from time to time in accordance with its terms.

2. Establishment of Trust

- 2.1 In consideration of these premises and in order to effectuate the desire of the Settlor, the Settlor doth hereby transfer onto the Trustees the said sum of Rs. 20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only) to have and to hold the same, subject to the powers, provisions, agreements and declarations hereinafter declared and expressed. The expression 'Trust Fund' shall include the said amount of Rs. 20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only) as well as any and all other sums, property, Assets that the Trust and/or the Trustees may (i) receive from any Person, whether as donation, grant or otherwise; or (ii) hold by way of purchase or by any other mode of transfer, grant or acquisition; or (iii) receive by way of interest accrued, dividends, rents or other income or accumulation however received for the time being and from time to time hereafter.
- 2.2 The Trust hereby declared shall be known as **"Gundavaram Vanaja Bhaskar Rao Vidyapeet"** (hereinafter also referred to as the said **"Trust"**) and shall not be for the benefit of any particular religion, sex, community or caste. The office of the Trust shall be at Plot No. 23, Bangalow No. 205, Card Maser Enclave, Tarbund, Sikh Village, Secunderabad - 500009 or at such other place as the Board of Trustees may decide from time to time.
- 2.3 The Trust and the Trust Fund shall be irrevocable for all times.
- 2.4 The Assets of the Trust shall be held on trust by the Trustees and shall be managed, operated and administered on the terms contained in this Deed.
- 2.5 There is no movable or immovable property during the registration of the Trust.
- 2.6 The Trust shall commence on the date of this Deed and is absolute and shall be irrevocable.

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3. Objects

The objects of the Trust ("Objects") are enhancement of education and imparting knowledge to students of all age groups and shall include the following:

- (i) to set up, establish, acquire, aid, administer, operate and maintain, in India or outside India, educational institutions of any and all types, including universities, colleges, schools, coaching centers and other educational institutions, for imparting education in any or all faculties and courses including pre-primary, primary, secondary, higher, degree, professional and technical courses, whether undertaken through in-class room, distance education or otherwise;
- (ii) to establish student friendly environments in the educational institution/s of the Trust on the models of courseware/content of contemporary teaching institutions with supporting entities providing research / development and implementation of new improved teaching techniques so as to prove that in-depth learning means studying thoroughly and not rigorously;
- (iii) to impart such education to children / students in conformity with the norms and standards of any and all types of Boards including the Board of Secondary Education, Board of Higher Secondary, Indian Council of Agricultural Research, relevant authorities under the Telangana State Private Universities Act, 2018 (as amended) and/or any other competent authority which is deemed fit for offering such course, by the educational institutions;
- (iv) to provide skills to manage in a competitive environment and a rapidly changing standards of competitive skills and provide the best of facilities to the student to develop such skill to sustain in this competitive environment;
- (v) to conduct studies, conferences, seminars, workshops and study circles and to print, produce, publish, exhibit and distribute, films, journals and periodicals, books, lectures and other reading and pictorial materials for the diffusion of useful knowledge in keeping with the afore- stated Objects including but not limited to providing scholarship, loans, grants and fellowships, instituting chairs and further provide training or study opportunities for people in the field of development and ecological work;
- (vi) to establish, manage, operate and / or maintain infrastructure facilities for operating the same as convention centres, conference centres, hostels, canteens etc., and provide space where persons who share the vision of the Trust can interact with each other and in the process help promote the aforesaid objectives;
- (vii) to utilize the Trust Fund and Assets for the benefit of the Trust and its Objects and at no time and under no circumstances shall the Trust Fund or Assets shall be alienated, except as specified in this Deed;



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- (viii) to appoint, remove, change, alter, delegate or outsource necessary support services or facilities as may be required, from time to time, for educational institutions of the Trust;
- (ix) to appoint advisors, professionals, eminent persons, educationalists and to form committees of the above for assisting the Trust in fulfilling its Objects;
- (x) to enter into alliance with, cooperate or affiliate with such bodies organizations that have similar objectives or those that help in the advancement of Objects;
- (xi) to do all other acts and things as are conducive or helpful to the advancement and fulfillment of the principal Objects above mentioned.

4. Information and Inspection

4.1 The Board of Trustees shall furnish to each Trustee the following information in respect of the Trust and the Institutions:

- (i) Audited annual Financial Statements within 90 (ninety) days after the end of each Financial Year;
- (ii) Unaudited quarterly Financial Statements within 30 (thirty) days from the end of each calendar quarter;
- (iii) Monthly management information statements within 15 (fifteen) days from the end of each month;
- (iv) Any information relating to the occurrence of any event which would, or is likely to have a Material Adverse Change on the Trust or any Institution, within a maximum period of 7 (seven) days from the date the Trust has knowledge of the same;
- (v) Details of all material litigation, and all material filings made with any statutory authority, by the Trust or any Institution, within a maximum period of 7 (seven) days from the date the Trust has knowledge of the same;
- (vi) A monthly report, no later than the 15th (fifteenth) of every month, specifying the following information:
 - (a) The number of fresh admissions and new teachers in the previous month;
 - (b) Gross receipts in the previous month;
 - (c) Statement of parents' complaints, if any, both solved and unsolved.





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(vii) The minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees within a period of 30 (thirty) days from the date of the relevant meeting or at the next meeting of the Board of the Trustees, whichever is earlier.

(viii) Any other information or documents reasonably requested by any Trustee, in writing.

4.2 The Trustees shall be entitled to inspection and visitation rights in respect of the Trust. The Trust shall give full access to the Trustees and their respective authorized representatives to visit and inspect all properties, Assets, corporate, financial and other records, reports, books, contracts and commitments of the Trust and/or any Institution.

5. Accounts and Book Keeping

5.1 The Trustees shall manage the Trust Fund as per the rules hereof and may pay, expend or utilize the Trust Fund and other amounts of the Trust towards the Objects, including creation of Assets and infrastructure for furthering the Objects as also towards preliminary expenditure for setting up the Institutions, as the Trustees shall in their discretion decide, but subject always to the other provisions hereof. It is expressly declared that no part of the income or corpus of the Trust Fund shall be employed for any object or purpose other than those of the Trust set out aforesaid. It is also expressly declared that the Trust Fund, hereby created is not for the purpose of discharging any obligations of the Settlor, Trustees or any other person, nor for the purpose of any benefit to the Settlor, Trustees or any other person, save and except upon Trust as hereby declared.

5.2 It shall be lawful for the Trustees, subject to the provisions hereof, to frame rules and regulations for administration of the Trust and for regulation and conduct of meetings of the Trustees. The Trustees from time to time alter, vary, modify, in writing, such rules and regulations and substitute other rules and regulations in lieu thereof.

5.3 The Trustees shall be at liberty to retain the Trust Fund in the state in which they receive it or invest the same or any part thereof in or upon any investment for the time being authorized by law for investment by trusts and with further powers to invest the same subject to any enactment regulating investment of such funds with any one or more of the following investments in or upon:

- (i) Fixed deposits with any of the Scheduled Bank or Banks;
- (ii) Any security as specified in Section 11(5) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 or any statutory modification thereof;
- (iii) The purchase of lands or immovable properties in India;
- (iv) Construction or purchase, leasing, renting of buildings, tenements, properties, as may be required for the fulfillment of the Objects;



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And the Trustees shall be at liberty to vary and transpose the same into investments of the same or a like nature from time to time as and when they shall in their absolute discretion think fit and as may be permitted by the laws in force for the time being.

- 5.4 The accounts of the Trust shall be opened and maintained in the name of the Trust in a Nationalized Bank/ Scheduled Bank as the Trustees shall decide from time to time. The accounts shall be operated by the persons as designated by the Trustees from time to time. The Trustees shall examine the said accounts as and when required. All cheques and orders for the payment of money shall be jointly signed by Trustees or by such persons as are empowered to operate the accounts by the Trustees. Every sum of money received on accounts of the Trust shall be forthwith deposited and credited to the Trust account or accounts.
- 5.5 The Trustees shall maintain true and accurate accounts of all money received and expended and of the matters in respect of such receipts and expenditure took place. The account books shall be maintained on regular basis and completed at the end of each Financial Year, i.e., 31st March of each year, when consolidated statement of income and expenditure account and Balance Sheet for the year shall be prepared and thereafter be placed before the Trustees at a meeting for approval.
- 5.6 The accounts and consolidated statements shall be examined and passed by the Trustees at their first meetings of the following year or at such other meetings as may be called for the purpose. The accounts shall be duly audited (with all the necessary vouchers / supporting papers) at least once a year by a chartered accountant appointed for the Trust by the Trustees.
- 5.7 All books and records, title deeds and other documents of properties of the Trust shall remain in the custody of the Trustees at the office of the Trust and under the direct control of the Trustees or such other person as the Trustees may designate.
6. Subject to other provisions of this Trust Deed, the majority of Trustees shall have a final decision in matters relating to the Trust including utilization of properties of Trust and appointment, retirement or replacement of existing Trustees, as deemed necessary.
7. The Trustees shall have the right to enter into contracts for carrying on the day to day workings of the Trust, through a Trustee / Trustees appointed by the Trustees, who shall act for and on behalf of the Trustees in all matters as designated including in regard to employment of personnel as necessary, appointment of agents, professionals at such salary / remuneration as the Trustees may think proper, and the Trustees may at any time suspend or dismiss such persons and to do all other things and acts incidental to or connected with the furtherance of the Objects, as also delegate authority for the day-to-day administration of affairs of the Trust, as required from time to time.



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8. The Trustees shall be responsible for the following:

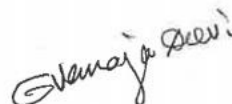
- (i) to implement the Objects and rules of the Trust and implement its projects and the decisions of the Trustees in all matters;
- (ii) to prepare and maintain of minutes and proceedings of all Trustee meetings;
- (iii) to maintain accounts of the Trust Fund and ensure proper utilization and investment thereof as per this Deed and present the same at all Trustee meetings;
- (iv) to maintain the bank account/s and monies of the Trust as per the terms and conditions set-out herein;
- (v) to ensure compliance of all legal & statutory requirements, including audit of the Trust from time to time;
- (vi) to call for meeting of the Trustees from time to time;
- (vii) to delegate such matters including day to day actions required to be taken / done including correspondence, maintenance of documents and general secretarial work of the Trust including execution of agreements, arrangements and contracts approved by the Trustees.

9. All charges and expenses of or incidental to the administration of the Trust shall be first defrayed by the Trustees out of the Trust Fund. Subject to the payment aforesaid, all the yearly income of the Trust shall be paid expended or utilized for fulfilling the Objects and running the Institutions.

10. Powers of the Trustees

10.1 For achieving the Objects, the Trustees shall act as per law established and have following powers and authorities to:-

- (i) make, alter and amend rules for the administration of the Trust and for carrying out day to day requirements of the Trust.
- (ii) purchase, mortgage, acquire in exchange or dispose, sell or otherwise transfer of any property, moveable and immoveable and Assets for the benefit of the Trust.
- (iii) hire or take on lease, let or license, any immoveable or moveable property for the purposes of the Trust at such price or upon such rents and on such terms and conditions and for such period and with and without option for renewal as the Trustees may think fit;



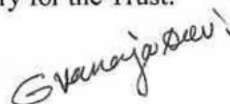
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- (iv) appoint and dismiss and reappoint teachers, professionals, managers, staff, employees, servants, clerks, care takers and others on such salary and on such terms as they think fit as required for educational institutions.
- (v) appoint and remove managers for assisting in day to day administrative affairs of the Trust, as also delegate or assign any other activities as required from time to time.
- (vi) delegate by Power of Attorney or otherwise to any Trustees or other persons, any powers as may be required to be vested by the Trustees but the Trustees shall be held liable or responsible for the acts or defaults of any such person but only for their own respective acts and defaults.
- (vii) accept donations of money and / or any property moveable or immoveable on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may think fit not being inconsistent with the Objects and the Trustees may accept a condition that such donation or any part thereof may be expended and applied in the name of the donor or any other name which the donor may indicate.
- (viii) appoint any person or persons to fill any vacancy or vacancies of the office of Trustee or Trustees, provided always that the number of Trustees shall not exceed 11 (eleven) and not be less than 3 (three).
- (ix) decide all matters relating to the administration of Trust and Trust Fund and the decision of the Trustees on all such matters shall be final.
- (x) make payments for the purposes of expenditure for the Trust, subject to the same being duly accounted for and audited.
- (xi) grant lease in future on any property of the Trust for such period and on such rental terms and conditions for the benefit of the Trust and income received there from shall be treated as income of the Trust.
- (xii) reimburse themselves or pay and discharge out of the Trust Fund or its income all expenditure that may be incurred for fulfillment of the Objects of the Trust, including holding of meetings, travel and other activities, the reimbursement shall not be operative in case of a Trustee held liable for a loss caused to the Trust by any act or inaction.
- (xiii) file and defend any legal proceedings taken in respect of Trust and its activities and establishments, to take all legal actions to protect the Trust, Trust Fund and Assets, enforce right and title over the Trust through the Trustees and for the same to sign, declare and file proceedings, pleadings, affidavits and other documents, appoint, dismiss and reappoint advocate / counsel, to pay fees and incur expenses for any proceedings, acts and things as may be necessary for the Trust.



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- (xiv) Take-over, acquire, manage, control or aid any existing trust, society or Section 25 / Section 8 Company whose objects are either wholly or in part similar to the Objects, on such term and conditions as may be thought expedient.
- (xv) to establish, operate, maintain and from time to time alter, expand or reduce, takeover, acquire, control, merge, combine, control, or close, sell educational institution/s as also facilities of such educational institution/s and other centers for education;
- (xvi) borrow money, raise loan from persons, financial institutions, banks other authorized lending organizations for the attainment of Objects of the Trust and for borrowing and raising loans, pledge or hypothecate the property of the Trust;
- (xvii) enter into a or undertake such transactions, contracts or other activities as are conducive for attainment of the objectives of the Trust.
- (xviii) apply the whole or any part of the income of the Trust, or the Trust Fund or accumulations thereto, to any one or more of the Objects of the Trust, as the Trustees may, in their discretion, deem fit from time to time.
- (xix) appoint attorneys or agents for the Trust and to delegate limited power to such attorney as may be required from time to time and to remove such attorneys or agents and to appoint other or others in their place.
- (xx) give aid by way of donations, out of the income or the corpus of the Trust Fund or otherwise, to different educational institutions, societies, organizations or trusts in India, which may have been established or which may hereafter be established for like educational purposes.
- (xxi) settle accounts, file petitions, applications and legal proceedings for and in the name of the Trust, to compromise, compound, settle or refer to arbitration any such proceeding or disputes in respect of claims, demand or things, as deemed expedient for the Trust and management of its properties as also to safeguard against any loss occasioned to the Trust.
- (xxii) enter into all types of agreements / contracts with individual, trust, association of persons, bodies corporate, firms and others for the management of the Trust and for the attainment of the Object.
- (xxiii) adjust, settle, compromise, compound and refer to arbitration all actions, suits, claims and demands and proceedings regarding the Trust Fund.
- (xxiv) make, vary, alter or modify schemes, rules and regulations for carrying out the Objects of the Trust and for management of affairs thereof and / or running any educational institutions in furtherance of the Objects.



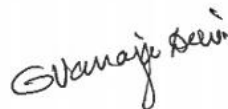
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- (xxv) set apart and / or allocate the whole or part of income or the corpus Trust Fund or part thereof for any of the Objects:
- (xxvi) apply to the Government, public bodies, urban, local, municipal, district and other bodies, corporations, companies or persons for and to accept grant of money, aid, donations, gifts, subscriptions and other assistance with a view to promote the Objects and to discuss and negotiate with government authorities, public and other bodies corporations, companies or person, schemes and other works and matters within Objects and to conform to any conditions upon which such grants and other payments may be made.
- (xxvii) purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the property, Assets, liabilities in the name of Trust as decided by the Trustees as per their discretion and engage any one or more of the trusts, societies, institutions or associations those which are taken over by this Trust.
11. The Trust may form committees comprising of experts, professionals, eminent persons to assist the Trustees in fulfilling the Objects of the Trust. Such committees shall evaluate, estimate, recommend, to the Trust for fulfilling the Objects of the Trust.
12. The Trust shall give receipt through the Trustees for any money, security or property transferred to the Trust which shall effectually discharge the person or persons so paying transferring the same.
13. If any of the Trustees die or desire to be discharged or refuse or become incapable to act or is adjudicated insolvent or convicted of a criminal offence involving moral turpitude and punished with imprisonment exceeding six months or be absent from India for a period of 12 months or more without obtaining the leave of the other Trustees in writing or absconding for a period of six months or is incapable of being a trustee as per applicable, then the surviving or the continuing Trustee/s for the time being may, subject to the other provisions hereof, appoint another person or person/s as Trustees. Such appointment of new trustee shall be made by consensus of majority of Trustees. Without prejudice to the aforesaid, the Trustees shall be entitled to appoint additional Trustees for the Trust.
14. All Trustees appointed are on the express condition that he / she shall not charge any fee or remuneration for any work to be done by him / her in connection with the Trust. A Trustee shall be entitled to claim expenses of travel and other out-of-pocket expenses incurred by him / her for attending meeting of the Trustees or any sub-committee thereof.
15. Any Trustees being an advocate, architect, accountant or other professional person shall be entitled to be paid usual professional charges for professional services rendered to the Trust.





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16. Liability of Trustees

The Trustees shall be respectively liable for their actions in conformity and shall be answerable and accountable only for their own acts, neglects and willful defaults and not for those of each other nor for those of any bankers, brokers or other person in whose hands any trust moneys or securities may be placed nor for deficiency of funds or security nor otherwise for any voluntary lossess unless the same shall have happened due to or through their or his own willful defaults.

17. Meeting

(i) The Trustees may, from time to time, frame rules for the conduct and regulations of the meetings of the Board of Trustees. In the absence of such regulations:

- a) 2 (two) Trustees shall constitute quorum for a meeting of the Board of Trustees;
- b) All matters will be decided mutually by the Trustees and by passing an Ordinary Resolution.

(ii) A resolution passed without any meeting of the Board of Trustees but by circulation thereof and evidenced in writing under the hands of two thirds of the Trustees shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution passed at a meeting of the Board of Trustees.

(iii) Notice for meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be sent to each Trustee at least 7 (seven) days prior to the meeting together with the agenda, and the relevant documents for the same, unless all Trustees agree to meet at shorter notice. All notices for all meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be in writing.

(iv) No matter other than the matters set forth in the agenda circulated to the Trustees prior to a meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be passed at any meeting of the Board of Trustees and/or by circular resolution.

18. Transactions with Related Parties

The Trustees may:

- (a) Sell, purchase or otherwise dispose of or acquire any asset to or from any Related Party; or
- (b) Enter into any contract, agreement or other arrangement with any Related Party to provide management, administration or other services for the Trust; or
- (c) Enter into any other transaction with any Related Party in relation to the Trust; or



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- (d) Cause any Trust Funds or assets that comprise cash to be invested or lodged with any related party.

Provided that the Trustees in good faith are of the opinion that the particular transaction is on reasonable commercial terms and is in the best interest of the Trust.

19. Miscellaneous

- 19.1 Subject to provisions of this deed, any agreement or instrument may be signed, executed and registered by any Trustee duly authorized by a resolution passed by the Trustees in regard thereto and such agreement or instrument, so executed by a Trustee shall be deemed to be signed, executed and registered by or on behalf of all Trustees for the time being.
- 19.2 The operation of the Trust shall be in the whole of India and outside of India, subject to applicable laws.
- 19.3 The Trustees may merge the Trust into a Society, Section 8 company, firm and / or other trust which has similar objects as this Trust.
- 19.4 The Trustees shall have the power to determine in case of doubt whether any money or property shall for the purpose of the charity be considered as capital or income and whether out of income or capital any expense or out goings ought to be paid or borne and every such determination shall be binding and conclusive provided that nothing contained shall be deemed to authorize the trustees to spend the income or corpus of the Trust for any purpose not authorized by these presents.

20. Amendment to Trust Deed

If the Trustees are desirous of altering, changing, modifying, deleting or adding any clause or clauses of their Trust deed, then any such alteration, change, modification, deletion or addition would necessarily have to be done in writing and signed by each Party. Further, such alteration, change, modification, deletion or addition shall be undertaken by following necessary procedures and prescribed by the Indian Trust Act. Additionally, if the Trust is registered under Section 12AB or Section 10(23C) or under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act, then the approval of the commissioner of Income tax or such other relevant authority shall be procured, if required under applicable law.

21. Transfer of Trust

- 21.1 To transfer or hand over the Trust to any other trust, society, institution or organization in case of winding up of this Trust, the Trustee shall transfer all the Assets of the Trust remaining after clearing off all its debts. The Trustee shall do so with the prior approval of the commissioner of Income Tax having jurisdiction over the Trust and on such Trust and on such terms and conditions the commissioner of Income tax shall impose and the transfer of the assets shall be done as mentioned above, only to the trusts, societies, institutions or



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organizations having similar objects as that of this trust and which are having registration under Section 12AB or Section 10(23C) or under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act and the properties handed over as stated above to other trusts, societies, institutions or organizations shall bear the name of this Trust and shall be maintained as a separate entity by the absorbing Trust.

21.2 It is expressly declared that no part of the Trust property or its income or any accretion there to shall be distributed among the members of the Trust either directly or indirectly by way of profit or dividend or otherwise.

21.3 The benefits of the Trust are open to all irrespective of caste, creed, community, sex, religion etc.

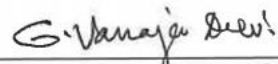

The University follows a continuous evaluation framework designed to ensure fairness, transparency, and holistic assessment of student performance. The components of evaluation for each course are predefined by the concerned faculty and communicated to students at the beginning of the semester through the Course Description Document.

Structure of the Examination System

(a) Written Examinations

Typically, two formal examinations are conducted:

- Mid-Term Examination
- Semester-End Examination

(b) Continuous Assessment by faculty through:

- Class Assignments
- Quizzes
- Group Projects
- Seminars
- Viva-Voce
- Other innovative methods as deemed appropriate by the course faculty

(c) Practicals

- For lab/field-based courses, evaluation includes day-to-day assessments and/or mid-term/end-term examinations, as defined by the faculty.

(d) Special Courses

- Predefined rules are in place for evaluating internships, fieldwork, projects, dissertations, and industry-linked courses.

The specific details of examination and evaluation for each programme are outlined in the respective academic regulations and rules.

Methods of Evaluation of Answer Scripts

- Answer scripts are evaluated by internal faculty members.
- Guidelines are in place for moderating and validating question papers and model answers before evaluation begins.
- To maintain transparency, evaluated answer scripts are shown to students before final submission to the Examination Section.
- Grading is carried out in accordance with the University's Grading Policy:
 - Course-level moderation is done by the Departmental Grading Committee.
 - Normalization is ensured by the School Moderation Committee.
- External examiners are involved for the assessment of projects at all levels, as well as for the evaluation and defense of Ph.D. theses.

Guidelines for Setting Question Papers

The University has established guidelines to ensure that examinations fairly assess student learning outcomes as well as the effectiveness of faculty teaching.

- Objectives of Assessment:
 - To evaluate the extent of student learning.
 - To discriminate fairly among good, average, and below-average students.
- Communication of Outcomes:
 - Students are informed of course outcomes and evaluation parameters at the beginning of each semester/term through the Course Description Document

 - Question papers are set by external examiners from other Universities and cover the entire syllabus and are structured with a balanced distribution of difficulty levels, in alignment with Bloom's Taxonomy.

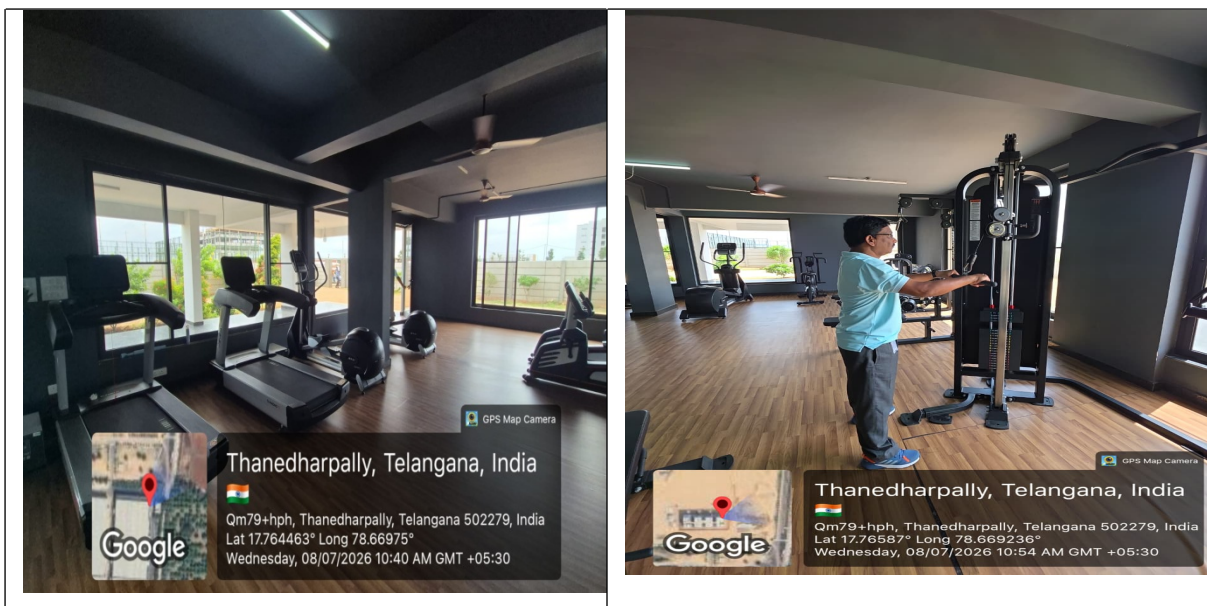

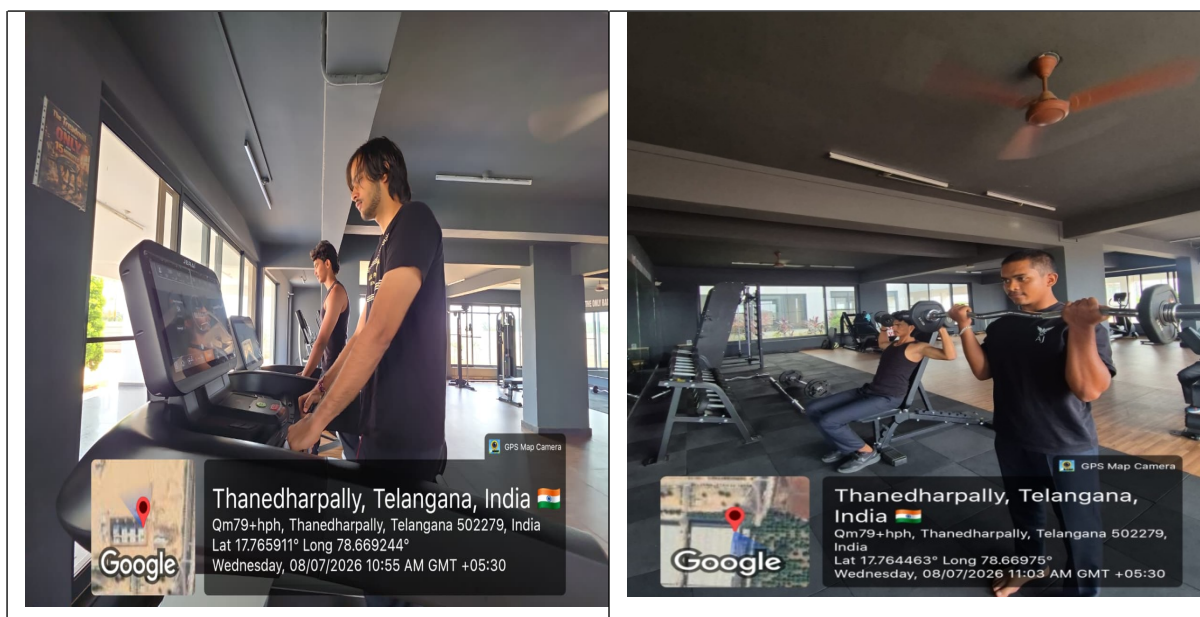

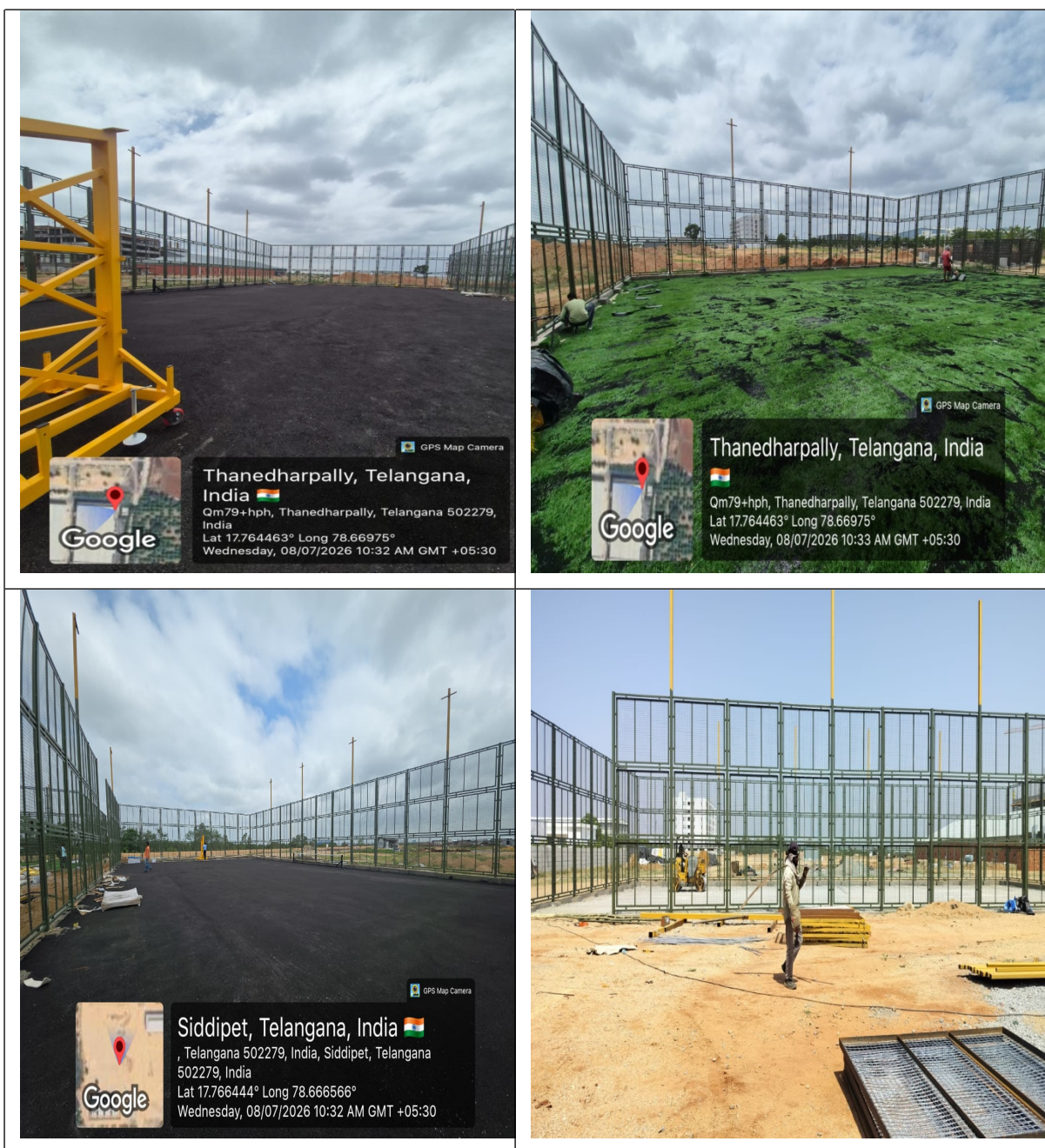
